


How things stand: Climate crisis



Met Office Climate Dashboard








To show love of neighbour...

3 things to be mindful of as we take action

1. TALK ABOUT IT.

Make sure climate and nature crises and what we can all do about them are subject of weekly prayer, regular discussion, sermons, displays, events.

Creation-tide is not just for September and October...but every season.

Eg at Christ Church West Wimbledon over past decade:

- two community eco-festivals
- *Changing Our Planet* pre-COP26 community event with Churches Together, 9th October 2021

- weekly Green Prayer - and ever-present theme for intercession prayers

- ever-present theme for social committee, garden team etc - not just the Eco-Church group

- themed editions of church magazine
- Junior Church and teenagers' group activities
- Creation-tide photo and artwork displays

2. INDIVIDUAL ACTION NEEDS SAFETY AND STRENGTH IN NUMBERS.

- It's easy to feel overwhelmed as an individual trying to take action...

- We need to know we are not alone in taking steps to change lifestyles...

- Do things at home and work along with relatives, friends, neighbours and colleagues...

- Your church's *congregational community* is a powerful source of encouragement, shared ideas and practices...

3. CHURCH ACTION NEEDS TO BE AMPLIFIED THROUGH WORK WITH OTHERS.

- Just as we shouldn't try to 'DIY' eco-action as individuals and need support from others...
- So the Church needs to make common cause and collaborate with other bodies...
- Local councils, charities, businesses, NHS, National Trust, universities...
- Local climate change commissions (Surrey has one)...
- And other faiths...as in Faith for the Climate network...
